Further to my email this morning on Eisg Brachaidh, I have now had a helpful conversation with Jimmy. You will not be surprised to know that he has some very serious doubts as to whether this project can go ahead within the timescales we have agreed with Woodland Trust.

## The two key issues are:

- 1. The withdrawal of the LP match funding (which they must have known about for some time) and how they plan to make up the shortfall of £145k in income.
- 2. We have said that we would only fund this if it could be delivered in its entirety by the end of March 2022. The timeline is now showing that the fencing contract will be confirmed sometime in January rather than the previous "best case of 26 October and worst case of 17 November, so a two month delay, with final activity going into April at least.

Jimmy has suggested that in the first instance that I should go back to them to establish how they intend meeting the financial shortfall. I am very happy to do that if you think that is the best way forward.

I just wanted to give you a quick update on the meeting held with WTS on the Eisg Brachaidh project yesterday. In short, it is now clear that there is no chance of the project being completed by the end of March 2022. Kath Leys confirmed that there is no opportunity to roll any funding over into the next financial year. We do not yet know what the new NRF fund is going to consist of, so there is absolutely no guarantee that there will even be an opportunity for them to apply to NS for future funding (in another competitive process) for this project. However, we have said that we will pay for whatever work is completed up to the end of March. We made it clear that we will not pay for materials etc purchased in what we consider to be advance of need.

Everyone present acknowledged that it will require a degree of good fortune and no further delays to be able to even get work underway within this financial year, however, we have left the door open just in case. Kath has urged WTS to have a think about a date when they need to make a final decision about whether to proceed with anything this year or accept that none of the BCF money can be drawn down.

WTS have stated that they continue to be fully committed to the project and that they intend applying for different sources of funds from elsewhere. They have committed to updating me on progress (or lack of it) at the beginning of each month as a minimum and certainly to inform me of any significant developments.

Hope this helps. I will keep you updated.

Hi Chris, Donald and Graeme cc Cat,

For info (see chain below), Woodland Trust Scotland emailed today to confirm that they will not be proceeding with the BCF2 Eisg Brachaidh grant. We have been in touch with them regularly over the past 2 years but had to advise recently that in the light of the closing down of BCF for the new NRF2, we wouldn't be able to offer additional carry forward for a BCF2 projects than had not actually accepted the grant offer or begun at all. If they had actually started to deliver the work we would probably have been able to carry it forward but unfortunately they have been engaged in a long and protracted preparation phase which they won't be able to complete and make a substantive spend before the start of winter and the end of the FY.

I would hope that this would generate as much negative publicity as the original grant to fund did. I have advised them to continue their preparations as it might be possible to fund it through NRF2.

We are very grateful to NatureScot for your support, understanding and flexibility over the BCF offer. Regrettably, as you know, the EIA situation diverted our focus and resources significantly in recent months. The EIA process itself was subject to considerable delays, meaning that progress has stalled and we are much further behind where we would like to be. Whilst we have identified suitable consultancy support to help us finalise the EIA report, their availability in the next month or so to progress what's needed means there is no realistic possibility of completing the EIA process and secure a decision before March that might allow us to proceed or make any real progress in the BCF eligibility context with the fence, if indeed that is the outcome of the EIA. Given that level of uncertainty, we feel our only course of action is, with regret, to return your kind offer of BCF support.

We will continue to work with EB and all parties necessary to secure positive outcomes for the future of EB's valuable woodlands and associated habitats, and hope to continue the positive relationship we have with Nature Scot colleagues in this respect.

Once again, thank you for you support. Happy to discuss any aspects of this decision should you wish or need to.
